

At the **F. Wayne Hill Water Resource Center** in Buford, 27 of our volunteers recently toured it to learn more about how wastewater from Gwinnett County is cleaned and returned to the environment. One of the interesting things we were told was "We are only speeding up what nature does on its own". We also learned that one of the byproducts of the wastewater was made into fertilizer and sold to help offset some of the costs of the facility.
