This opportunity to learn how electricity is generated, delivered, and used will enlighten you. We also should discover some intriguing history of Atlanta, our transportation and power systems, and the importance of our rivers, particularly the Chattahoochee. This tour, an especially rare opportunity, has been postponed and rescheduled several times (due to COVID-19).

Morgan Falls Hydro Project began commercially operating in 1904. Georgia Power operates the project in a modified run-of-river mode primarily to generate power and to re-regulate peaking flows from upstream Buford Dam. Morgan Falls Hydro Project is capable of producing 16.8 megawatts of electricity, and can supply enough energy to power over 10,000 homes annually. Hydro power accounts for approximately 2 percent of Georgia Power's total generation output.
