Gwinnett Police extends mental health partnership with View Point Health

The Gwinnett Police Behavioral Health Unit contract with View Point Health has been extended. The program pairs a police officer with a licensed mental health clinician in co-responder teams. This approach allows Gwinnett Police to provide specialized support to individuals facing mental health crises. The unit plays a key role in answering routine and emergency calls with an opportunity for residents to receive the care they need.
